

Hey Y'all —

All right...let's get physical...no wait, philosophical...

What is it that a duck hunter wants? Waterfowl to hunt and a place to hunt them! Yeah, that's about it, but then, I suppose it's not just any place to hunt; a place where there actually are some ducks to shoot at would be nice...a place we don't get yelled at by folks passing by in their cars...a place we can enjoy taking our family members or others hunting every now and then...and maybe a place with space enough it that doesn't add frustration to our lives. Then, as for having ducks to hunt, maybe a duck hunter wants to provide nesting habitat, wintering habitat, or water for ducks. Maybe a duck hunter wants to learn how to call a duck. Maybe a duck hunter wants to paint a duck or carve a decoy to enjoy the art of waterfowl. Maybe to build the perfect duck blind is in the cards, or exploring new ground and what's over the next hill. And then it seems that duck hunters may want to support the right to bear arms and defeat laws and rules that put hunters at a disadvantage. Or maybe just try to make hunting a bit better for next year or the next Generation. Or maybe even start a duck hunting business of one sort or another. In the end, it seems to a duck hunter may want any or all of the above, and in a word, it's about enjoying the Heritage. It is my job as president of WWA to support the WWA mission and chapters such that duck hunters have a place to do any and all of the above, in the process moving WWA into the future.

As you read the chapter news on the following pages...you'll find how the WWA is putting its mission into practice for waterfowl, hunting, and hunters.

One of the greatest threats to hunting are anti-hunting groups. A primary leader of anti-hunting efforts is the Humane Society of the United States or HSUS, a group whose name is even a disguise, designed to evoke an emotional wallet opening, in the name of **local Humane Society operations which have no relation whatsoever to the HSUS**. The hidden agenda of the HSUS is slowly coming to light thanks to groups like the U.S. Sportsman's Alliance and the WWA. Recently, Charity Navigator, the nation's largest and most-utilized evaluator of charities, stripped their rating of HSUS and other animal rights groups and replaced them with a "Donor Advisory" warning. A "Donor Advisory" means that "serious concerns have been raised about this charity which prevents the issuance of a star rating." In addition,

Born Free USA, Animal Protection Institute, Fund for Animals, and Animal Welfare Institute, each have had their charity ratings revoked. This means that these groups don't even get a one star rating. Spreading this word is important, because the HSUS and these other groups are simply, plainly, and irrationally opposed to hunting...and are even opposed to the use/domestication of animals. This downgrade by Charity Navigator is yet one more part of society realizing the ineffective, insincere, and disingenuous agenda of the HSUS.

Finally, for this month, we have worked over the years to form bonds between the **WWA and agriculture**. The Moses Lake Chapter has been farming for years (see the Moses Lake Chapter news for a new grant win). Now, I would like the WWA to expand its farming capability. I am looking for farming implement donations, or tractors and equipment that we can fix up, and/or use for cheap or free, to work the land, plant crops, and hopefully harvest a portion of the crop to pay for the plantings. We intend to start small, but we need to find and gain access to this equipment before we can move forward with a plan to find land to farm. Ultimately, WWA needs a set of farming implements available in several regions of the state. Can you help us reach this goal? Let me know.

Chapter Awarded \$20K+ ALEA Grant

The Moses Lake Chapter recently was awarded an Aquatic Lands Enhancement Account (ALEA) Volunteer Cooperative Grant of \$20,575 for one of our projects. The project — Frenchman Registered Access Area ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) Hunting Blind, will be completed during the budget cycle period of July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

The project consists of building a road through the restricted access area and constructing an **ADA** compatible hunting blind on one of the ponds within the restricted access area. The access to the road will be controlled with a padlock on the gate requiring the person to have a reservation made to use the site prior to accessing it. The **Frenchman Restricted Access Area** is open to hunting on all legal goose days in the region.

2nd ALEA Grant Request Denied for Now

Our grant request for the **Gloyd Seeps Area** was denied at this time because of the uncertainty of water availability to the site. This is still a valuable project when and if **Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)/Bureau of Reclamation** ever get the water flowing in the **North Crab Creek** arm on a year round basis.

The area will prove to be a productive waterfowl area with numerous new ponds. When the test flow was done a couple years ago in the spring, there were many small ponds occupied by ducks.


Annual Picnic is July 27th



May Meeting

A well-attended May meeting included 35 members, drawn by **Arlan Hackett's** mouthwatering prime rib and an informative presentation on the **Shillapoo Wildlife Area** by **WDFW Manager Daren Hauswald. Daren** talked about what to expect for next hunt season. Heavy late rains and the lack of an assistant in the wildlife area present a challenge for crop planting and mowing this year.

Daren gave a power point presentation on the current scoping process to assess the possibility of breaching the Columbia River and Lake River dikes to create juvenile salmon habitat. We had thought this was a dead issue, but apparently there is a great desire to push forward on this. The program scoring process reveals that Buckmire Slough is a real possibility, but the historic Shillapoo Lake bed area looks much less likely. This is a very powerful train being driven by salmon dollars federally through Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) and the fisheries portion of the WDFW. As an organization we have opposed the proposed projects. We do not want to see a vibrant, food rich, wildlife area converted into a large "carp farm" devoid of food for migrating waterfowl.

We installed some wood duck nesting boxes on the **Cedarville Farms** property in Oakville, in March, and the hens are lining up for them. So, we installed two (2) more. That makes 26 nest boxes that our Chapter has responsibility for. If you have any children, I would urge you to get them involved in the **WWA** nest box program. It's an educational experience that is hard to equal. You can bird watch all day long, but to see a wood duck propagate in one of your hand-made nests is hard to beat. RECIPE OF THE MONTH **DUCK SLIDERS**

- **INGREDIENTS** 2 T cider vinegar
- 1.5 to 2# duck breast meat
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 1 tsp chile powder
- 1/2 tsp garlic powder
- 3 T vegetable oil
- 2 C ketchup
- 1/4 C brown sugar

- 2 T sov sauce
- 4 Chipotle Peppers in adobo Sauce
- 2 T adobo Sauce
- 1 C diced onion
- 4 C onion strips
- 20 slider buns

DIRECTIONS

- Butterfly duck breasts and gently flatten to 1/8 inch with mallet.
- Combine salt, pepper, chili powder and garlic powder. Sprinkle seasoning mix on both sides of duck breasts.
- Heat vegetable oil in large sauté pan over high heat. Pan-fry duck 5 minutes on each side, until well browned.
- In small stainless steel bowl, combine ketchup, brown sugar, cider vinegar, soy sauce, peppers, adobo and diced onion. Purée until onions and chipotles are fine mince. Heat sauce gradually in small saucepan over low heat.
- 5. Thin slice duck. Add barbecue sauce and mix well. Heat duck until it reaches internal temperature of 160°F.
- 6. Deep-fry onion strips in 350°F fryer for 4 to 5 minutes. Drain well.
- 7. Place ½ cup of duck on each bun. Spread 2 tablespoons fried onions over duck. Cover with top of bun and serve.


