Hev Y'all,

It is definitely time to get the dog in shape and clean-up the decoys and boats. Had the Brewer's 20th annual duck jerky party this past weekend. Only three duck hunters (the ones who shot most of the ducks) were present, so am spreading the love to friends and family. One of my huntin' buddies stayed over to Sunday so we could figure out how to fix one of our Kevlar marsh boats, and go through our wad of (what many of you would consider ancient) decoys. I think a couple of the Carry-Lite decoys we have are over 30 years old now, and might be in need a bit of paint. We use long anchor lines of about 15 to 20 feet because we hunt the bay and while we are usually in one to four feet of water, sometimes decoys are in a channel that may be 10 or 15 feet deep, with current. So, the long lines are sometimes necessary. But anyway, we got through about a hundred decoys, used a solder gun with pointed tip to melt and mold the plastic over and seal-up a few pellet holes here and there, and threw out a few that the dog chewed the tails off of, likely while frustratingly waiting for us to actually knock down a duck. A few of the weighted keel decoys had lost their keel "weight" so (you might be a redneck if) you pour some quickcrete into the empty keels and get it wet so it solidifies, keeping the self-righting weighted keel feature functional. We got the fixed-up lightweight decoys into bags for carrying and hauling in the marsh boats, and piled the heavy decoys into the big boat. Dang...we're just about ready...oh yeah, except for all that other stuff to do still.

Wholly smokes it has been a busy month; had the duck calling contest with a good number of callers. Special shout out to Avery, Saunder's Calls, Pacific Calls, and Buck Gardner calls for contributing to the event, to Waterfowl Evolution (look for them on Pursuit Outdoors Channel) for showing up...hopefully they got some footage, and to all the judges and other volunteers that helped us out. Pat Murphy of PNW Performance Dogs and Cascade Hunting Retrievers Club helped too and had their own Duck Dog Challenge event going on that day. And finally a thanks to chapter chairmen



In case you missed our September 8th Chapter meeting, our guests **Dave McCormick** and **Jonathan Kitchens**, the owners of **Know Where to Hunt** made a presentation to our group with has arranged for and set up hunting access on numerous private fields across the **Skagit Valley**. Here are excerpts from a recent Press Release from them:

To: Washington Waterfowl Association Members:

"I would like to personally extend an invitation to participate in **Know Where To Hunt, LLC's** Inaugural Season. Our business focuses on working with farmers/landowners to identify potential properties and fields with specific guidelines set forth by the farmers, for the purpose of waterfowl hunting. Also, Full Season members can purchase additional guest passes throughout the year.

"The 3-Day Membership is \$59.99. At this level of membership, you get Scouting Alerts by email/phone; Hunting Reminders by email/phone; and when properties become available due to cancellation. This is a great option for family friends and guests coming in for the holidays.

"The 1-Day Membership is \$29.99. At this level of membership, you get Hunting Reminders by email/phone; and when properties become available due to cancellation. This is a great option for family friends and guests coming in town, with a limited amount of free time.

"We are currently working with Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), Ducks Unlimited (DU), and other WA waterfowl conservation organizations to identify potential areas of conservation that Know Where To Hunt, LLC can assist/contribute. Know Where To Hunt, LLC is working with local farmer/landowners, and the WDFW to implement an after season hazing program. This will help reduce crop loss due to waterfowl damage while allowing farmers/landowners to plant a higher yielding and higher profit margin winter crop.

The Sky is Falling (with waterfowl)

The ducks are here! I've spotted several species of them in a spot noted for its world class duck hunting. We've seen cinnamon and blue wing teal; a new family of mallards; and two (2) ruddy duck. 




