



Plans For The Year

We have several projects on our plate for 2016 starting with completion of the ALEA grant we received for stream bank stabilization and nesting cover at Rd. 19 N.E. and Willow Lake Road. The new Middle Crab Creek water delivery system to Moses Lake has created an island at maximum flow and we will be planting 10,000 trees and shrubs on the island to prevent erosion of the bank and planting nesting cover on the island for Waterfowl, Upland birds, and song birds.

In May we will conduct our annual Goose nest count on Potholes Reservoir followed by a potluck picnic for all. If funding can be found we will also have a work party to rebuild the handicapped hunting blind at Buckshot Ranch on the Columbia River above Priest Rapids dam. Blind was originally built over 20 years ago by volunteer help from Washington Duck Hunters, the forerunner of WWA.

In September we will again be assisting on the opening day Youth event in September at Mar Don Resort. It will have a little different format this year, so watch the website for specific details or the newsletter as we come up with specifics.


