

2017 NDSCS Duck Stamp Poll Results

The results of the 2017 NDSCS Duck Stamp Poll are in! Unfortunately there were only 15 qualifying ballots this year, but voting was quite varied, with the stamps of 20 different states receiving attention one way or another.

Each year we feature the NDSCS poll to get membership feedback on the products of the state duck programs. It should be stated - up front - that there is no way this can be an apples-toapples comparison for judging Not only are the formats and requirements different from state to state, but artists' handling can be very different, as you are no doubt well aware. While we do feature a "Best Design" category, it (like the others) is simply a subjective opinion and not fine art critique. Still, we'd

like to think that the results of our polls help artists and state programs shape future stamps.

To get to the point, the "Best Design" category featured a two-way tie between Ohio (one of last year's winners) and Washington State, each with three votes. Arkansas was close behind with two. Both entries are

Arkansas was close ficting with two. Both this year is that these are two very different shown nearby. What's interesting (again) this year is that these are two very different stamps; the Ohio stamp is part of an overall A1M pane design and format (it isn't offered separately), and the Washington State stamp is a single design that features a dog very prominently.

For "Most Favorite," this year's contest featured a three-way tie between Ohio (top right), Arkansas and Pennsylvania.

The "Favorite" category (obviously voted upon differently by NDSCS members than "Best Design") resulted in a three-way tie between Ohio, Arkansas and Pensylvania, with two votes each. The strong showing by Ohio in both of these categories leads me to declare it the official overall winner in this year's contest.

Conversely, there was no competition for "Least Favorite," which went – hands down – to Rhode Island, with five votes (or one-third of the total), followed by Alaska, with three votes.

The winner of this year's prize (donated by Bob and Rita Dumaine of Sam Houston Duck Co.) is John Benza of Bronx, N.Y. He will receive two DVDs (including *The Million Dollar Duck* and

America's Darling: The Story of Jay N. "Ding" Darling), as well as a hardcover copy of The Wild Duck Chase, by Martin J. Smith.

When government agencies think they can do whatever they please, we have to fight for what is right. We are seeing loss of hunting opportunities and open public lands as the (agencies) tell us it will be mitigated. The areas that WE paid to create for waterfowl conservation are getting changed for unproven recovery of other species. We feel this is unacceptable as many of those areas were put in place because of loss of habitat due to development. The waterfowl will suffer as the areas created for them are diminished.

There are a few ways we can fight this but we will need a bigger number of waterfowlers to send messages to their legislators. There are over 44,000 authorizations to hunt waterfowl sold in our state every year. If all of them would participate in our efforts we would be a formidable entity to contend with.

We need more members. Plain and simple. A small fee of \$30 dollars a year is all it takes. If just ten percent (10%) of those members volunteer for the events we have we would be in heaven! The **Grays Harbor Chapter** always gets the volunteers we need and that is why we are enjoying success!

This blind was built at the **main Samish Unit** under the leadership of **Brian Gibson** of Stanwood. **Brian,** age 16, is an active Scout in his local Troop, and the blind is his **"Eagle Scout" service project**.



U.S. House Passes Bipartisan Bill to Save Endangered Salmon, Selectively Remove Sea Lions

Good news: my bipartisan bill to lethally remove the most egregious sea lion predators that are devastating our salmon and steelhead runs passed the U.S. House yesterday with a strong, bipartisan 288-116 vote.

For the salmon and steelhead fighting to make it upstream, yesterday's vote in the U.S. House significantly improves their chances of survival. The passage of my bipartisan bill signals a return to a healthy, balanced Columbia River ecosystem by reining in the unnatural, overcrowded sea lion population that is indiscriminately decimating our fish runs.





Move back to 20 yd, shoot clay 3

Move back to 22 yd, shoot clay 4

Move back to 24 yd, shoot clay 5

Rotate to post 2, 24 yd, shoot clay 6

Move forward to 22 yd, shoot clay 7,

Continue moving 2 yards for each shot forwards and backwards at each post. Ending on Post 5, 24yd. Report score.


Event III




