

The projection for this year is about the same. We need to stop the bleeding in order to continue our "Hunters for Conservation" mission. We need to curtail some of the programs we pay for and get back to volunteerism. One example, the monthly fee for the Wild Apricot computer program (that manages our membership database, website and email blasts) is increasing it's fee by 20% beginning in April.

By now all your waterfowl hunting equipment is cleaned and stowed unless, your hunting in one of the extended season Goose Areas 1 or 2. Soon it will be Turkey season, and I'll be dusting off my calls, scouting out some new territory and trying not to be outsmarted by that big tom. This is also the right time of the year to prepare for the next season. Your involvement in chapter activities and the ideas you bring to the **WWA** that enhance our waterfowl hunting heritage are just what we need.

February Chapter Meeting -Wood Duck Box Build:

More nesting boxes for the next generation of ducks! Attendance was light due to the weather, but we managed to build half of the 15 new Wood Duck boxes at our February meeting and planned their placement. Your bifocals, power screw drivers and some of those season hunt stories were greatly appreciated. With these additional boxes we will have almost 40 boxes deployed in the area. All boxes and nesting tubes are logged on a spread sheet with their locations, and the members that maintain them identified.

We also reviewed maintenance plans for existing Boxes and Nesting Tubes the Chapter has deployed. Wood Duck box maintenance starts immediately, and in March we will complete the maintenance on the 20-plus Mallard Nesting Tubes in the area. Thanks to our volunteer members for the time they put forth for this conservation effort. If you would like to volunteer for these activities please contact me.

March Chapter Meeting:

March Chapter Activity:

Don't forget to report your waterfowl harvest!! Sea Duck, SW Canada Goose, Snow Goose and Brant reports are **due by March 20, 2019**! You must report hunting activity on your harvest record cards to **WDFW** using the online reporting system at: fishhunt.dfw.wa.gov/, or by mailing the cards to:

Wildlife Program - Waterfowl Section
PO Box 43141
Olympia, WA 98504.

Reports need to be postmarked by the reporting deadlines even if you did not harvest any birds.

If you're participating in the **USFW Migratory Bird Harvest Survey** for waterfowl (ducks, sea ducks, geese, and brant), the surveys should be submitted now unless you're hunting in one of the extended season Goose Areas 1 or 2.
