

Hello Fellow Waterfowlers:

Another of our priceless waterfowl hunting areas is on the chopping block all in the name of fish habitat. The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) and the Skagit Watershed Council (SKC) want to breach the dikes on the Farmed Island Unit of the Skagit Wildlife Area in order to enhance the Deep Water Slough for fish habitat. All at the price of one of the premier waterfowl hunting area in the state, with absolutely no regard for the ducks, geese and other wildlife that use the area.

NW Chapter Chairman, Rick Billieu and I recently attended a meeting with the Director of the **SKC** and a WA State Legislator concerning the area. Both **Rick** and I came away from the meeting with the impression that the Director of **SWC** is set on his agenda for the breeching of the dikes. We are also set in our opposing views. Contact your State representatives expressing your displeasure with this project. Tell your friends to get the word out!

The **WDFW** has set up an Advisory Committee concerning the Skagit Valley. There has been no date set for the first meeting. When a time is set an email blast will come out with the date. I ask that we attend the meeting in mass. Let's show these people that we mean business.

On another note I did attend the **Whatcom's Chapter** meeting on Tuesday, May 7th. There was a good turn out to hear **WDFW Waterfowl Section Manager, Kyle Spragens'** presentation on how our waterfowl hunting dates and seasons are set within the 107 days allowed by the **US Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS).**

The 2019-2020 WA state duck stamp is out, and it's fantastic! The **WWA Duck Stamp Committee** works hard at developing and obtaining the artwork for both the stamps and prints. According to Committee Chair **Mike Bell**, there is

2019 Duck Stamp Artist & Stamp

Meet the 2019 Washington State Duck Stamp Competition Winner and Washington Waterfowl Association's (WWA) Artist of the Year: Catherine Temple.



Catherine Temple is a wildlife and pet portrait artist residing near Clarkston, Washington. In this rugged, beautiful and diverse terrain she finds the inspiration for her art while pursuing her other passions of photography, bird watching and hunting with her husband, Brian and dog, Balin.

Catherine began her love affair with art, birds and dogs at an early age in rural northern Illinois. Her father had a passion for raising exotic birds and animals and this gave her ample opportunities to develop her drawing skills as well as her love of nature and the outdoors. As an adult she continued to hone her skills by studying biology and taxidermy to better understand the anatomy of the birds and animals she loved to paint.

When she acquired her first hunting dog, a Chesapeake Bay retriever named **Jake**, a deep bond was formed. Out of love for her dog she decided to paint his portrait and soon discovered that there were others who loved their dogs as much as she did. This developed a new direction for her art, and she has since created dozens of portraits for pet owners across the country.

Primarily a self-taught artist, **Catherine** enjoys painting with water-based media, especially acrylic, as this gives her the most versatility in creating the detail and realism that her art is known for. As she develops the painting, she almost always completes the eyes

first as she believes this brings the spirit and character of the animal to life. This is also what most people viewing her paintings comment on first.

In recent years all of **Catherine's** passions of art, the outdoors, ducks and dogs have led her to begin entering duck stamp contests. She received her first win with the **2017-2018 Delaware Duck Stamp** depicting her Chesapeake Bay retriever, **Balin**, and canvasback ducks. Most recently she was chosen to create the **2019-2020 Washington Duck Stamp** which depicts a chocolate lab and ring-necked ducks. Her canine art has garnered awards from **Art Show at the Dog Show** in Witchita, Kansas, and she has won several awards locally for her wildlife art.

Catherine considers her art to be a calling, one that is both challenging and fulfilling and a gift from God that she is to share with others. She continues to enjoy participating in the realm of duck stamp competitions as well as showing her work locally and regionally and completing commissioned work for her collectors.

Oregon Waterfowl Festival June 21st-23rd



April Meeting:

A **BIG THANKS** to **Martha Jordan** for her power point presentation on lead poisoning of waterfowl — most specifically her beloved Trumpeter Swans. Unfortunately the most recent examples from last hunting season were locally in Snohomish County at the **Crescent Lake Unit** within the **Snoqualmie Wildlife Area.**

Lead shot has been banned in WA since the early 1990's, but lead shot left from decades of waterfowling in our area before the lead ban continues to take it's toll on all waterfowl. It takes as few as two (2) lead pellets to kill a Trumpeter swan, the largest waterfowl in North America! Ironically it is this huge white bird — easily spotted in the muddy fields and lakes — that acts as the "canary in the coal mine" to give biologists a estimate of just how many other more camouflaged waterfowl die each year from lead poisoning.

Martha has moved on from the national Trumpeter Swan Society to form a local organization to more readily respond to the stewardship and conservation of Swans in NW Washington. That organization is Northwest Swan Conservation Association [https://nwswans.org/], of which she is Executive Director. The WWA-Seattle Chapter unanimously voted to donate \$1,000 to Martha and NW Swans to continue their great work which ultimately benefits all waterfowl.

WA Brant Festival and Decoy Carving Competition

Chris is well known as one of the most prolific banders of wild waterfowl ever in North America and his involvement with cutting edge satellite tracking technology. Also a master carver, he will also be bringing some works to display and chat about.

Champion Carver, Tom Newell of **LaConner.** Also attending will be expert **Mike Miller** with his books documenting the history of west coast decoys.

Competition classes include Novice, Pro, a special Mini, and the **Ducks Unlimited** State Championship. Other displays will include **WA Waterfowl Assoc (WWA)** mounted birds display trailer, **Air Strike Bird Control Live Raptors**, and various outdoor & decoy vendors such as **Jerry Corrion, Dennis Fisk,** and Craig **Cimmiyotti** from Oregon.

The week-long camps for both Boys and Girls are held at the Camp Moran Environmental Learning Center in Moran State Park on Orcas Island in mid July.

Girls Camp is – Sunday, July 14 to Saturday, July 20. Boys Camp is Sunday, July 21 to Saturday, July 27. Since 1952 the Washington State Youth

Conservation Camp (also known as the WA State Junior
Sportsmen's Conservation Camp) has been educating
campers ages 12 to 16 about the outdoors, and how to
wisely enjoy them. They encourage conservation methods
to ensure our resources will be there for "future
generations." The camp is located on breathtaking Orcas
Island at the foot of Mount Constitution, in the
Environmental Learning Center of Moran State Park.

Activities include Archery, Hunter Safety Training [Range use is restricted to spring loaded BB guns. No live firearms are brought to camp], Survival in the Outdoors [including shelter building; fire building, and water collection], the basics of fishing [in a stocked lake], how to canoe, and a 6-mile, day hike DOWN Mount Constitution with a stop for a picnic lunch and a fun visit to Cascade Falls.

Campers are grouped by age. There are 8-12 campers per cabin. Each cabin is assigned a Senior and Junior Counselor. Cabin assignments may be requested, but placement cannot be guaranteed.

There will be a Senior AND a Junior counselor assigned to each cabin. There will always be one with their campers/cabin at all times (outside of free swim time and meal time); including at night.

Junior counselors often range in age from 16-18. Senior counselors range from 17-23. All counselors have previously been outstanding campers and/or who showed the ability to lead by example, the maturity to follow instructions, and the responsibility to make good decisions. They go through training before camp begins, and meet with the Head Counselor daily throughout the week.

Camp will have a licensed nurse on staff, able and trained to deal with emergency situations, as well as everyday cuts and scrapes. There is an ambulance and emergency clinic on the island as well.

All staff and instructors receive a comprehensive national screening and background check.



When the river is high this area is prone to flooding so maintenance of the ramp is necessary throughout the year.








TREASURER'S REPORT
